In CPE theological students, laypersons, ordained clergy, medical staff, mental health professionals and members of religious communities learn clinical pastoral skills and relationship “tools” to effectively minister to people. Through practical clinical experience, written case studies, individual supervision, relevant reading and seminar participation, students are encouraged to develop competent and caring pastoral relationships and skills. CPE credit will be accepted for national Clinical Chaplain and/or Pastoral Counselor certification through the College of Pastoral Supervision and Psychotherapy (CPSP).
